FAQ's Producers & Retailers

Q: How big are the stalls?

A: Stalls are 8ft x 4ft. Please ensure you bring a cloth to cover the stall.

Q: Is there access to a power supply?

A: Limited access is available, please contact the organisers prior to submitting your application to see if any powered stalls are still available. All electrical equipment must have an up to date Portable Appliance Test (PAT). See Health and Safety Act (1974).

Q: What are Tesetas?

A: Due to food handling restaurants do not accept cash in exchange for food and drink. The festival currency for acceptance at restaurant stalls ONLY is the teseta. Please DO NOT accept payment by tesetas as this will not be redeemed.

Q: Can we offer free samples?

A. Producers and retailers are encouraged to offer small free samples of their products

Q: Can I serve alcohol & other beverages?

A: Yes you may serve a range of drinks including alcohol. As this is a family event we would prefer you to offer small measures of alcohol and if possible to offer at least one non-alcoholic choice.

Terms & Conditions for Exhibitors

1. Exhibitors must ensure that they are adequately insured. **Copies of public liability certificates must be returned with your booking form.**
2. Exhibitors must carry out a risk assessment for their stalls and provide a copy to the organisers by 25th June 2010. Guidance can be provided.
3. Exhibitors must ensure that all relevant electrical equipment has had updated Portable Appliance Testing (PAT). See Health and Safety Act (1974).
4. Exhibitors must comply with legislation regarding health and safety.
5. Exhibitors selling consumable goods must comply with legislation regarding food hygiene.
6. No vehicle movements will be allowed on the site from 60 minutes before opening time and 15 minutes after closing time.
7. Exhibitor stands must not exceed the area booked.
8. All stalls and pitches must be staffed, stocked and open during the festival's opening hours. The festival will be open between 11am & 4.30pm, with tastings finishing at 4pm.
9. Exhibitors must regularly clear all rubbish and debris from the vicinity of their stalls. *Containers for this will be provided. The exception to this is used cooking oil which must be removed by the exhibitor at the end of the day.*
10. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to safeguard their property. The festival's office does not accept any responsibility whatsoever for any losses.
11. Any exhibitor who fails to attend, or any restaurant seen to accept cash payment will be prohibited from participating in any related marketing activity for a minimum of 12 months.
12. **Retailers** are required to bring a cloth to cover their stall which will hide items stored underneath.
13. Where possible the festival office will place stalls offering similar produce apart.
14. The organisers reserve the right to amend booking information and rules and regulations. Updated amendments will be sent to exhibitors.
15. Stall fee is strictly non refundable.
